

Medicaid

Medicaid provides health coverage to millions of Americans, including income eligible parents and children, pregnant women, elderly adults and people with disabilities.

If you answer “yes” to any of the questions below, you or your family may qualify for Medicaid.

1. Are there any children in your household?
2. Is anyone pregnant in your household?
3. Are you 19-20 years of age or 65 years of age or older?
4. Do you have a medical condition that will prevent you from working for the next 12 months?



If you qualify for Medicaid, your health care-related travel and accommodation costs may be paid for by Medicaid. It also covers medical visits, behavioral health services, dental, and vision at Tribal health facilities. If going outside a Tribal health facility for your care please make sure to obtain a referral or ask the service provider if they accept Medicaid.



Medicaid income guidelines change often, so if you were once ineligible for being over income, you or your family may now be eligible. Please contact the ANMC Health Benefits Specialists to get rescreened.

Below is what your Medicaid card looks like. Please let the front desk staff know if you or your family have Medicaid, so they can add it to your records.
