Prevention of Influenza Transmission in the NICU

PURPOSE:

This document explains the steps to be used to prevent the transmission of influenza to the newborn from the mother or other ill persons.

SCOPE:

All organizational components of the Alaska Native Medical Center (ANMC) accredited campus defined as its staff, students, interns, volunteers and contractors.

PROCEDURE:

- 1. Mothers with suspected or confirmed influenza should be separated from their baby until:
 - a. The mother has received antiviral treatment for >48 hours
 - b. The mother is afebrile without antipyretics for >24hrs, and
 - c. The mother is able to cover her cough and respiratory secretions.
- 2. Mothers who have recovered from influenza illness and meet criteria a c may visit their child while wearing a surgical mask for 7 days from start of illness.
- 3. Newborns of mothers with influenza can be cared for by a non-ill person using standard precautions and be closely observed for signs of infection.
- 4. Newborns of mothers with influenza that develops symptoms of influenza should be placed in droplet precautions.
- 5. Neonatal Intensive Care Unit:
 - d. Infants in the NICU born to mothers who have influenza will be spatially separated from other NICU babies by at least 6 feet and temporary barriers/curtains will be used.
 - e. Mothers who have met criteria a c and well visitors are allowed wearing a surgical mask and performing hand hygiene.
- 6. Influenza vaccination for all family and visitors will be encouraged by staff.

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
