Treatment Recommendations:

• The most effective nonsurgical treatment is patient reassurance. An Explanation of the condition and assurance of its nonmalignant nature is often the only treatment sought or required.

Referral Guidelines:

- Refer PAINFUL hand and wrist ganglions in patients willing to accept the considerable risks of surgery (recurrence, Infection, nerve damage with neuroma formation, arterial injury, scarring, etc.)
- Refer foot and ankle ganglions if painful & large.
- For ganglions in other locations, use body part specific referral forms for orthopedics
- Obtain Radiographs before referral
