## **Thyroid Nodules - General Surgery**

## **Indications**

- $\Box$  Thyroid nodule > 1 cm on ultrasound
- ☐ Thyroid nodule increasing in size on 2 subsequent ultrasounds

All patients should receive a thyroid ultrasound and TSH prior to referral

Call the surgeon on call for referrals for indications other then listed above

## **Patient information**

- Reassure the patient that the risk of malignancy is low
- The patient will most likely have a fine needle aspiration in clinic or will be scheduled for one in radiology using ultrasound guidance
- The patient does not need to be NPO or on any special diet or prep for the evaluation appointment.
- Plavex should be stopped 14 days prior to appointment, NSAID should be stopped 7 days prior to clinic if possible

## **Provider information**

- Masses < 1 cm should be followed with Q 6 month ultrasounds x 1 year and then Q 1 year x 2</li>
- Risk of cancer is generally low
- Risk Factors for Cancer
  - Age .20 or > 60
  - Male
  - Hx of neck irradiation
  - Family history of thyroid cancer
  - Rapid growth
  - Symptoms of mass effect
- Thyroid suppression treatment is **NOT** generally recommended
